CLARIFYING THE ROLES BETWEEN
COUNTY AND CITY GOVERNMENTS

Montgomery County Fire Service

Montgomery County Fire Service is a long-standing public/private partnership organized into five districts with nine stations that provide emergency response services outside the City limits. Each station is strategically located to ensure maximum participation by volunteer firefighters and rapid response to emergencies.

County Government provides the equipment, vehicles, utilities and insurance while the all-volunteer force provides the fire stations, personnel, fire hall furnishings, and most operational funding. Firefighters, their families and friends fundraise, solicit donations, often give of their own resources to serve the citizens of the County.

Training is required for all County volunteer firefighters, and they are paid per-call, after eligibility. The county volunteer district chiefs, district assistant chiefs, district training officers are also paid a monthly stipend. Currently there are 155 volunteer firefighters which include some City and Ft. Campbell firefighters. Last year the volunteer fire service responded to over 2,700 calls.

Clarksville Fire Department

Clarksville Fire Rescue is an ISO Class 2 rated fire department made up of 253 full-time employees dedicated to all emergency calls in the City of Clarksville. There are 12 fully-staffed fire stations strategically located throughout the City.

Clarksville Fire and Rescue routinely performs the following activities:

- Daily and Annual Training
- Fire Investigations
- Regular Life Safety Inspections
- Fire Suppression Activities
- Medical Assist Responses
- Public Fire Education Programs
- Safety Practices
- Vehicle Maintenance Procedures
- Technical and water rescue operations
