



Thank you for the opportunity to express my concerns/questions about the Re-Zoning Application CZ-2-2018. As a teacher I am not able to attend the 2:00 Planning Commission Meeting on 24 January, but I will plan to attend the public hearing with the Board of County Commissioners on 5 February.

I will begin by saying that I fully expected this agricultural land (in its entirety not just this "square") to be developed at some point with lots commensurate to the existing lots on Dunlop Lane and Charles Bell Road. With what I know from the re-zoning application provided to me, I have the following concerns that I would like you to consider.

- Concern that placing 9 lots in that 7.41 acre square will not "conform" to surrounding residential lots as the application implies. All contiguous lots are 1+ acres and lots in Boyer Farms are all 0.5+ acres.
- Concern that building 9 lots in that 7.41 acre square will cause run-off issues on my property (lot 38 Boyer Farms). The middle of the 7.41 acre square sits high and runs down toward my lot. If lots are constructed similar to those already on Dunlop Lane, run-off from building sites would be mitigated by "backyards" as they are with the current agricultural use. But if the area is over-built, I am concerned that the existing flood plain (running between the currently developed Dunlop Lane lots and the rest of the Boyer Farm lots) will be extended into my lot due to run-off. (Because it could be difficult to visualize, if anyone would like to see the situation in person, please just let me know.)
- Also, it is puzzling to me that agricultural land will remain on either side of the 7.41 acre square.

Again, thank you for considering these concerns now and I look forward to your feedback/resolve on 5 February.

**RESOLUTION TO RETAIN A DELINQUENT TAX ATTORNEY

WHEREAS, said duty needs to be met on a yearly basis as required by the statutes to fiscally and responsibly recover delinquent taxes and, through negotiation, to negotiate a reasonable fee for the services of a delinquent tax attorney.

RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE AND APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR AN ACTUARIAL STUDY IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$1,200.00 TO DETERMINE THE LIABILITY ASSOCIATED WITH ALLOWING CERTAIN ELIGIBLE EMPLOYEES AND FORMER EMPLOYEES OF A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION TO ESTABLISH RETIREMENT CREDIT FOR SERVICE RENDERED BY SUCH EMPLOYEES PRIOR TO PARTICIPATION IN THE TENNESSEE CONSOLIDATED RETIREMENT SYSTEM

WHEREAS, Montgomery County authorized its employees to participate in the Tennessee Consolidated Retirement System (“TCRS”) on July 1, 1966; and

WHEREAS, Montgomery County, pursuant to T.C.A. § 8-3601, did not designate participation for the county employees of the Clarksville-Montgomery County Industrial Development Board and the Clarksville-Montgomery County Tourism Commission; and

WHEREAS, Montgomery County adopted the TCRS Hybrid Plan for employees hired on or after January 1, 2017 through its Resolution to Change from the Tennessee Consolidated Retirement System’s Existing Regular Defined Benefit Plan (16-6-9); and

WHEREAS, Montgomery County desires to authorize county employees of the Clarksville-Montgomery County Industrial Development Board and the Clarksville-Montgomery County Tourism Commission to participate in TCRS in accordance with T.C.A. 8-36-919 pursuant to the plan terms set forth below; and

WHEREAS, the governing body of Montgomery County desires to consider the cost of allowing any employee of the Clarksville-Montgomery County Industrial Development Board and the Clarksville-Montgomery County Tourism Commission employed with Montgomery County on January 1, 2017 and continuously for the thirty (30) days immediately preceding the date to establish retirement credit in the Retirement System for service rendered to Montgomery County; and

WHEREAS, the basic actuarial study shall include the cost of determining the liability if, (a) the employer elects to purchase all of the employees’ years of prior service and (b) the liability if, the employer elects to not purchase prior service, but accepts the unfunded liability if the employee elects to establish all years of prior service.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Montgomery County Board of Commissioners meeting in regular session on this the 12th day of February, 2018, that there is hereby appropriated from the general funds of Montgomery County such amount as is required to pay for

the cost of the actuarial study, in an amount not to exceed \$1,200.00. Upon receipt of the actuarial study results, Montgomery County shall pay the cost for the study from the funds herein above appropriated to TCRS, or as otherwise directed by the TCRS Board of Trustees, and shall be fully reimbursed the cost of the study by or from the Clarksville-Montgomery County Industrial Development Board and the Clarksville-Montgomery County Tourism Commission.

A. TYPE PLAN. *(CHECK BOX 1 OR BOX 2 OR BOX 3 OR BOX 4)*. The Political Subdivision adopts the following type plan:

- (1) Regular Defined Benefit Plan.
- (2) Alternate Defined Benefit Plan.



AUTHORIZING, APPROVING AND DIRECTING THE EMPLOYMENT OF
CERTAIN LAW FIRMS TO REPRESENT THE COMMUNITY IN
POTENTIAL LITIGATION AGAINST CONTRIBUTORS OF
OPIOID ADDICTION CRISIS**

WHEREAS, the Community is experiencing serious Opioid use as a result of the ready availability of the drug and its abuse; and

WHEREAS, the Community desires to retain the Law Firms identified herein to advise and represent the Community regarding litigation and the award of damages from the contributors of opioids within the Community.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Montgomery County Board of Commissioners meeting in regular session on this the 12th day of February, 2018, as follows:

Section 1. The Governing Body of this Community, hereby authorizes and approves the employment of the law firms identified in the Legal Services Agreement, attached hereto and incorporated herein as **Exhibit “A”** (herein referred to as the “Law Firms”) to represent the Community in potential litigation against contributors of the Opioid addiction crises.

Section 2. The Governing Body hereby authorizes and approves, or confirms authorization and approval, of the Legal Services Agreement, substantially in the form attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference thereto as **Exhibit “A”**, and directs the authorized executor of this government to execute and enter into the Legal Services Agreement with the Law Firms, setting forth the scope of the work to be performed by the Law Firms, including litigation against contributors to the Opioid addiction crises within the Community and the terms and conditions of the employment of the Law Firms. The Legal Services Agreement may be amended, after approval of this Resolution, without further action of the Governing Body, with the approval of the authorized executor, whose signature on the Legal Services Agreement shall be evidence of such approval.

Section 3. If any section, paragraph or provision of this Resolution shall be held to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the invalidity or unenforceability of such section, paragraph or provision shall not affect any of the remaining provisions of this Resolution.

Section 4. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption as provided by law.

ENGAGEMENT TO REPRESENT

RE: Montgomery County, Tennessee civil suit against those legally responsible for the wrongful distribution of prescription opiates and damages caused thereby.

Montgomery County, Tennessee (hereinafter “CLIENT”), by and through its governing body, hereby retains the law firm LEVIN, PAPANTONIO, THOMAS, MITCHELL, RAFFERTY & PROCTOR, PA (“Firm”) pursuant to the Tennessee Rules of Professional Conduct, on a contingent fee basis, to pursue all civil remedies, as outlined in the Firm’s attached proposal publication, against those in the chain of distribution of prescription opiates responsible for the opioid epidemic which is plaguing **Montgomery County, Tennessee** including, but not limited to, filing a claim for public nuisance to abate, enjoin, recover and prevent the damages caused thereby. **Peter J. Mougey** of the law firm LEVIN, PAPANTONIO, THOMAS, MITCHELL, RAFFERTY & PROCTOR, PA shall serve as LEAD COUNSEL. CLIENT authorizes lead counsel to employ and/or associate additional counsel, with consent of CLIENT, to assist LEAD COUNSEL in the just prosecution of the case. CLIENT consents to the participation of the following firms (collectively referred to, herein, as “Attorneys”), if no conflicts exist, including but not limited to conflicts pursuant to and the Tennessee Rules of Professional Conduct:

In consideration, CLIENT agrees to pay thirty percent (30%) of the total recovery (gross) in favor of the CLIENT as an attorney fee whether the claim is resolved by compromise, settlement, or trial and verdict (and appeal). The gross recovery shall be calculated on the amount obtained before the deduction of costs and expenses. Total fees and expenses shall not exceed fifty percent (50%) of the gross recovery. CLIENT grants the Firm an interest in a fee based on the gross recovery. If a court awards attorneys' fees, the Firm shall receive the "greater of" the gross recovery-based contingent fee or the attorneys' fees awarded. **There is no fee if there is no recovery.**

LEVIN, PAPANTONIO, THOMAS, MITCHELL, RAFFERTY & PROCTOR, PA and/or the other law firms, hereinafter referred to as the "Attorneys," shall advance all necessary litigation expenses necessary to prosecute these claims. All such litigation expenses, including the reasonable internal costs of electronically stored information (ESI) and electronic discovery generally or the direct costs incurred from any outside contractor for those services, will be deducted from any recovery after the contingent fee is calculated. **There is no reimbursement of litigation expenses if there is no recovery.**

The CLIENT acknowledges this fee is reasonable given the time and labor required, the novelty and difficulty of the questions involved, and the skill requisite to perform the legal service properly, the likelihood this employment will preclude other employment by the Firm, the fee customarily charged in the locality for similar legal services, the anticipated (contingent) litigation expenses and the anticipated results obtained, the experience, reputation, and ability of the lawyer or lawyers performing the services and the fact that the fee is contingent upon a successful recovery.

This litigation is intended to address a significant problem in the community. The litigation focuses on the wholesale distributors and manufacturers and their role in the diversion of millions of prescription opiates into the illicit market which has resulted in opioid addiction, abuse, morbidity and mortality. There is no easy solution and no precedent for such an action against this sector of the industry. Many of the facts of the case are locked behind closed doors. The billion-dollar industry denies liability. The litigation will be very expensive and the litigation expenses will be advanced by the Firm with reimbursement contingent upon a successful recovery. The outcome is uncertain, as is all civil litigation, with compensation contingent upon a successful recovery. Consequently, there must be a clear understanding between the CLIENT and the Firm regarding the definition of a "successful recovery."

The Firm intends to present a damage model designed to abate the public health and safety crisis. This damage model may take the form of money damages and/or equitable remedies (e.g., an abatement fund). The purpose of the lawsuit is to seek reimbursement of the costs incurred in the past fighting the opioid epidemic and/or recover the funds necessary to abate the health and safety crisis caused by the unlawful conduct of the wholesale distributors and manufacturers. The CLIENT agrees to compensate the Firm, contingent upon prevailing, by paying 30% of any settlement/resolution/judgment, in favor of the CLIENT, whether it takes the form of monetary damages or equitable relief. For instance, if the remedy is in the form of monetary damages, CLIENT agrees to pay 30% of the gross amount to Firm as compensation and then reimburse the reasonable litigation expenses. If the remedy is in the form of equitable relief (e.g., abatement fund), CLIENT agrees to pay 30% of the gross value of the equitable relief to the Firm as compensation and then reimburse the reasonable litigation expenses. To be clear, the Firm shall

not be paid nor receive reimbursement from public funds unless required by law. However, any judgment arising from successful prosecution of the case, or any consideration arising from a settlement of the matter, whether monetary or equitable, shall not be considered public funds for purposes of calculating the contingent fee unless required by law. Under no circumstances shall the CLIENT be obligated to pay any attorneys fee or any litigation expenses except from moneys expended by defendant(s) pursuant to the resolution of the CLIENT's claims. If the defendant(s) expend their own resources to abate the public health and safety crisis in exchange for a release of liability, then the Firm will be paid the designated contingent fee from the resources expended by the defendant(s). CLIENT acknowledges this is a necessary condition required by the Firm to dedicate their time and invest their resources on a contingent basis to this enormous project. If the defendant(s) negotiate a release of liability, then the Firm should be compensated based upon the consideration offered to induce the dismissal of the lawsuit.

The division of fees, expenses and labor between the Attorneys will be decided by private agreement between the law firms and subject to approval by the CLIENT. Any division of fees will be governed by the Tennessee Rules of Professional Conduct including: (1) the division of fees is in proportion to the services performed by each lawyer or each lawyer assumes joint responsibility for the representation and agrees to be available for consultation with the CLIENT; (2) the CLIENT has given *written* consent after full disclosure of the identity of each lawyer, that the fees will be divided, and that the division of fees will be in proportion to the services to be performed by each lawyer or that each lawyer will assume joint responsibility for the representation; (3) except where court approval of the fee division is obtained, the *written* closing statement in a case involving a contingent fee shall be signed by the CLIENT and each lawyer and shall comply with the terms of the Tennessee Rules of Professional Conduct; and (4) the total fee is *not clearly excessive*.

LEAD COUNSEL shall appoint a contact person to keep the CLIENT reasonably informed about the status of the matter in a manner deemed appropriate by the CLIENT. The CLIENT at all times shall retain the authority to decide the disposition of the case and personally oversee and maintain absolute control of the litigation.

Upon conclusion of this matter, LEAD COUNSEL shall provide the CLIENT with a written statement stating the outcome of the matter and, if there is a recovery, showing the remittance to the client and the method of its determination. The closing statement shall specify the manner in which the compensation was determined under the agreement, any costs and expenses deducted by the lawyer from the judgment or settlement involved, and, if applicable, the actual division of the lawyers' fees with a lawyer not in the same firm, as required in Rule 1.5 of the Tennessee Rules of Professional Conduct. The closing statement shall be signed by the CLIENT and each attorney among whom the fee is being divided.

Nothing in this Agreement and nothing in the Attorneys' statement to the CLIENT may be construed as a promise or guarantee about the outcome of this matter. The Attorneys make no such promises or guarantees. Attorneys' comments about the outcome of this matter are expressions of opinion only and the Attorneys make no guarantee as to the outcome of any litigation, settlement or trial proceedings.

**RESOLUTION TO TERMINATE EXISTING INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT WITH
THE CITY OF CLARKSVILLE TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL FUNDS TO THE
MONTGOMERY COUNTY TOURIST COMMISSION**

WHEREAS, by Resolution 05-1-2, the Montgomery County Board of Commissioners approved an Interlocal Agreement between the City of Clarksville, Montgomery County, and the Tourist Commission for the City of Clarksville and Montgomery County to provide for an additional allocation of the City and County's proceeds from the occupancy tax commonly referred to as the Hotel/Motel Tax; and

WHEREAS, that Resolution was approved and adopted as required by law by the Montgomery County Commission; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the mandate of the Resolution an Interlocal Agreement between Montgomery County, Tennessee, the City of Clarksville, Tennessee, and the Tourist Commission for the City of Clarksville, Montgomery County, Tennessee, was prepared and executed on February 16, 2005, wherein generally the same referenced the existing private act establishing a privilege tax (commonly referred to as the Hotel/Motel Tax) by Montgomery County, Tennessee, allocating proceeds of the same to support the Tourist Commission, and proceeds of the same to go to the General Fund of the City of Clarksville, and the General Fund of Montgomery County, Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, the Interlocal Agreement further provided that of the portion of those proceeds allocated to the City of Clarksville and Montgomery County, Tennessee, they would therefrom allocate to the Tourist Commission an additional portion of their proceeds equal to 5% of the total proceeds of revenue payable to each entity in turn to the Tourist Commission; and

WHEREAS, the duration of that Interlocal Agreement was perpetual, however, any party thereto (the City of Clarksville or Montgomery County, Tennessee) may terminate the agreement effective June 30th of any calendar year by giving the other parties written notice no later than March 1st in the same calendar year of its intention to do so; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that Montgomery County, its officers and administrators, are directed to produce a notice as provided in the Interlocal Agreement, Provision 4, to terminate the existing Interlocal Agreement by and between Montgomery County, the City of Clarksville, and the Tourist Commission, and engage in discussions, review, and analysis so that an appropriate consideration of use of said revenues and funding of departments and programs might be considered by all parties; and further that the parties begin discussion regarding the same.
