SECTION 1. Tennesses Cade Annotated, Title 49, Chapter 8, Pert 81, is amended by adding the following as a new section:

- (a) Subject to available funding, the department of education shall Issue a grant to an LEA or public charter school if the LEA or public charter school establishes a grant program to promote positive mental fisalth for pre-kindergartan through grade five (pre-K-5) atudents, especially for students suffering from mental health issues as a result of the COVID-19 pendemic.
- (b) Each program exhabitished by an LEA or public charter school that receives a grant under this section must.
  - (1) Be implemented in the 2021-2022 and 2022-2023 achool years;
  - (2) Make training available to school counselors, educators, end parents to assist them in:
    - (A) Understanding how the COVID-19 pandemic has potentially affected students' mental health;
    - (B) Recognizing students who may be struggling with medial health issues, specifically mental health issues developed by students as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic;
    - (C) Identifying students with potentially severe mental health challenges who may need interventions;





- (D) Informing program participants about methods and techniques of intervention for students experiencing mental health challenges; and
- (E) Understanding the use of appropriate interventions based on the severity of students' mental health challenges;
- (3) Include Inharvention leahalques and resources to promote positive mental health for students; and
  - (4) Be implemented in compilance with § 49-2-124.
- (c) If an LEA or public charter school establishes a program in accordance with this section, then the LEA or public charter school shell aubnit a report on the program's implementation and outcomes to the department by June 16, 2022, for the 2021-2022 school year, and by June 15, 2023, for the 2022-2023 school year. The report must identify:
  - The number of students who participated in the program for the respective school year and the grade levels of the participants;
  - (2) The effects of the program on the mental health of students. Including, but not limited to, if the program reduced the frequency of behavior referrets for student violence, vandatam, harassment, intimitation, or bullying; and
  - (3) How the LEA or public charter school evaluates the effectiveness of the program oversit.
- (d) The department shall prepare a report of the data submitted to the department pursuant to subdivision (c), and shall submit the report to the governor, the chair of the aducation committee of the sensie, and the chair of the aducation administration committee of the house of representatives by July 1, 2022, for the 2021-2022 school year, and by July 1, 2023, for the 2023-2023 school year.

- (f) A student, who is under eighteen (18) years of age, shall not participate in the program unless the school has received from the student's parent, guardian, legal ouekollan, or caregiver under the Power of Attorney for Care of a Minor Child Act, compiled in title 34, chapter 6, part 3, written, active, informed, and voluntarity algoed consent that may be withdrawn at any time by the perent, guardian, legal custodian, or caregiver permitting the student to participate. An LEA or public charter school implementing a grant program under this section shell submit, progress reports of the student's activity in the program, at a frequency determined by the LEA or public charter school, to the student's perent, guardian, legal custodian, or careafver.
- (g) An aducator who completes the training described in aubtivision (b)(2) serus professional development points. The state board of education shall determine the amount of professional development points available to educators who complete the training.

# RESOLUTION OF THE MONTGOMERY COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS APPROPRIATING ARCHITECT FUNDS THROUGH THE BIDDING PHASE FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE EIGHTH CMCSS HIGH SCHOOL

WHEREAS, student enrollment combined at all high schools is at a capacity level of 91% and the middle school capacity level of 104% will be transitioning into the high schools; and,

WHEREAS, according to the Regional Planning Commission data, Montgomery County is experiencing continued growth throughout all regions of the County and the growth in the Northeastern quadrant is far out pacing the growth in the rest of Montgomery County; and,

WHEREAS, the Joint Land Acquisition Committee, has studied the real estate market and available land and is in the process of purchasing sufficient acreage for the construction of a high school on a new property located on Rossview Road in the Northeastern quadrant of Montgomery County; and,

WHEREAS, this high school will be designed using the West Creek High School prototype; and,

WHEREAS, the timeline necessary to insure completion of the prototypical high school architect project for a successful fall 2023 opening, requires the employment of an architect through the bidding phase; and,

WHEREAS, funds are now needed to proceed with the awarding of the architect contract.

WHEREAS, on March 3, 2021 the bid results for the 8<sup>th</sup> middle school, Kirkwood Middle, came in below the estimated construction costs. Sufficient funds in existing revenue bonds can be reallocated towards the architect contract for the 8<sup>th</sup> high school, Kirkwood High.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Montgomery County Board of Commissioners assembled in Regular Session on this 12th day of April, 2021 that this Commission expresses its intent to fund the construction of a new high school (currently estimated at \$57,610,000.00) and that the sum of \$1,832,360.00 be and the same is hereby appropriated to the School Capital Project Fund for the design fees of Kirkwood High School, located on the Kirkwood campus site.

RESOLUTION TO EXECUTE INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN THE INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT BOARD OF THE COUNTY OF MONTGOMERY AND MONTGOMERY COUNTY, TENNESSEE, REGARDING THE DISTRIBUTION OF PROCEEDS FROM SALES OF LAND ORIGINALLY PURCHASED BY MONTGOMERY COUNTY FUNDS AND HELD IN TRUST BY THE INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT BOARD ON BEHALF OF MONTGOMERY COUNTY, TENNESSEE

WHEREAS, Montgomery County, Tennessee, has made available funds to purchase certain real property which has been titled in the name of the Industrial Development Board for the County of Montgomery for the intended use in the promotion of industrial and economic development activities in Montgomery County; and

WHEREAS, such properties which were originally funded by Montgomery County tax dollars are recognized by IDB as being held in trust for such economic and industrial development purposes on behalf of Montgomery County, Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, some such properties now titled to IDB are not subject to any third-party rights nor any PILOT or any other Interlocal Agreement regarding the distribution of the proceeds of a sale; and

WHEREAS, Montgomery County, Tennessee, recognizes that in order to continue to promote and develop economic growth, industrial growth, and business activities in the area, funds are necessary for such use and that the proceeds from such property sales, originally funded by Montgomery County tax dollars, should be available for the continued growth and development of similar projects.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Montgomery County Board of Commissioners sitting on the 12th day of April 2021, that the properties listed on Exhibit A, attached hereto, are such properties titled in the name of IDB which were purchased by Montgomery County funds and that when these properties are sold or otherwise conveyed resulting in sales proceeds being available for distribution, such funds shall be distributed 90% to Montgomery County and 10% to the Clarksville – Montgomery County Economic Development Council; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Interlocal Agreement shall apply to all properties purchased in the future with the funds of Montgomery County, Tennessee, which might become titled in the name of IDB or the Clarksville – Montgomery County Economic Development Council as the county may direct, and which are not subject to any third-party rights nor a PILOT or specific Interlocal Agreement when sold with regard to the distribution of such sales proceeds; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that these funds payable shall not be expended on entertainment, travel, salaries, bonuses, or wages of any type and that an annual report of the expenditure of these funds which become payable to the IDB or the Clarksville – Montgomery County Economic Development Council shall be made by the IDB and/or the Clarksville – Montgomery County Economic Development Council on March 1 of each year to the Office of Accounts and Budgets of Montgomery County, Tennessee.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Interlocal Agreement, together with said  $\underline{\mathbf{Exhibit}}$   $\underline{\mathbf{A}}$ , is authorized to be executed by the Mayor of Montgomery County, Tennessee, to enter into this binding Interlocal Agreement.

MUTUAL WRITTEN INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT OF MONTGOMERY COUNTY, TENNESSEE AND THE INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT BOARD OF THE COUNTY OF MONTGOMERY IDENTIFYING INTERESTS IN REAL ESTATE PROPERTY PURCHASED BY FUNDS PROVIDED BY OR FROM MONTGOMERY COUNTY, TENNESSEE, AND DEDICATED AND CONVEYED FOR INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT, BUSINESS AND OFFICE DEVELOPMENT, OR OTHER ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

WHEREAS, Montgomery County has purchased properties, or provided the funds for the Industrial Development Board (IDB) for the County of Montgomery to purchase property and cause such property to be titled in the name of IDB to be held for the purposes of industrial and economic development in Montgomery County; and

WHEREAS, the IDB has successfully utilized such properties to promote and develop industrial and economic growth in the Montgomery County area and has achieved tremendous success in that regard; and

WHEREAS, as to some properties, but not all, agreements now exist which outline the distribution or return of the proceeds from the sale of such properties; and

WHEREAS, all properties which have been purchased with funds provided by Montgomery County and are now held in the name of the IDB which are not subject to any third party claims nor any PILOT or otherwise subject to an Interlocal Agreement applicable to such properties, have been identified and are listed as <a href="Exhibit A">Exhibit A</a> attached hereto and it is recognized that such properties are now held by the IDB for the sole and exclusive use and purpose of industrial and economic development, business and office development and other economic development and for no other purposes; and

WHEREAS, in the event of the sale or conveyance of any said properties listed on <u>Exhibit A</u>, it is the intent of these parties that all proceeds from the sale of such properties listed on said <u>Exhibit A</u> shall be distributed in accordance with this Interlocal Agreement and shall be held and used for the express purpose of promoting economic, business, and industrial development in Montgomery County in order to provide funds for the development of land and programs to support the industrial development and business growth in the Montgomery County area through the funding of the Clarksville – Montgomery County Economic Development Council.

THEREFORE, the parties now formally declare and mutually agree, consent and acknowledge to be bound as follows:

- (1) All such properties listed on <u>Exhibit A</u> are held by the IDB in trust for the benefit of Montgomery County for the sole and exclusive use to promote industrial development, economic development, business and other development and for no other purposes; and
- (2) All properties listed on <u>Exhibit A</u> are held by the IDB without an existing Interlocal Agreement and are not subject to any third party claims nor any PILOT Agreement or any other agreement regarding the distribution of the proceeds from such sale; and
- (3) From the date of the execution of this Agreement, all proceeds from the sale of these properties shall be distributed 90% to Montgomery County and 10% to the Clarksville Montgomery County Economic Development Council in furtherance for such purposes set out above and for no other purpose.

FURTHER, the parties hereto mutually consent, agree and acknowledge to be bound that in addition to the properties listed on Exhibit A, any future properties which are purchased with funds provided by Montgomery County, the title to which property is placed in either the Clarksville – Montgomery County Economic Development Council or the Industrial Development Board (IDB), shall be held by them in trust for the purposes set out herein or as the County may direct, and in the event of the sale of any of such properties such funds shall be distributed according to this Agreement or as may be provided in an Interlocal Agreement specifically applicable to such property having been sold.

FURTHER, the parties hereto mutually consent, agree and acknowledge that these funds payable shall not be expended on entertainment, travel, salaries, bonuses, or wages of any type and that an annual report of the expenditure of these funds which become payable to the IDB or the Clarksville – Montgomery County Economic Development Council shall be made by the IDB and/or the Clarksville – Montgomery County Economic Development Council on March 1 of each year to the Office of Accounts and Budgets of Montgomery County, Tennessee.

FURTHER, the parties hereto mutually consent, agree and acknowledge to be bound by this Interlocal Agreement which may be executed in several counter parts including via facsimile, each of which shall be deemed an original for all purposes, including judicial proof of the terms hereof, and all of which together shall constitute and be deemed one and the same Agreement.

FURTHER, the parties hereto mutually consent, agree and acknowledge to be bound that the purpose of this Interlocal Agreement is to comply with the provisions of Tennessee Code Annotated § 12-9-101 regarding Interlocal Agreements between local government units.

WHEREAS, the Parties hereto mutually consent, agree and acknowledge to be bound that this Interlocal Agreement does not supersede or supplant any Interlocal Agreement now in effect between the County and the Industrial Development Board (IDB).

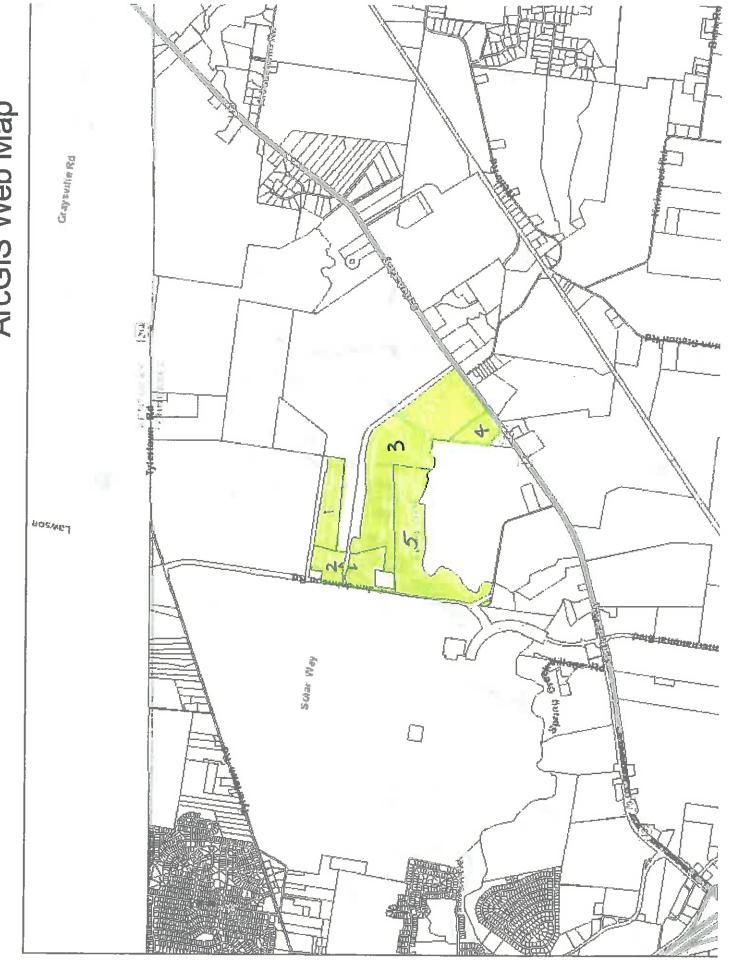
