WHEREAS, the federal government has made funds available for local governments to address food insecurity in their respective districts; and

WHEREAS, these funds will be administered through the Tennessee Department of Economic and Community Development in the form of a reimbursable grant to provide to local governments; and

WHEREAS, these funds will be used for the purpose of purchasing equipment and supplies needed to increase capacity with partner agencies; and

WHEREAS, no matching funds are required for this grant by Montgomery County Government; and

WHEREAS, Montgomery County Government would like to submit a grant application not to exceed five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000).

WHEREAS, the Clarksville-Montgomery County Tourist Commission (Tourist Commission), as the community’s Destination Marketing Organization, is eligible to apply for a \$188,641 grant from the Tennessee Department of Tourist Development for marketing to visitors; and

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING TDOT ASSISTANCE IN CONSTRUCTION AND COMPLETION OF A DEDICATED ROAD TO THE LG CHEM SITE KNOWN AS BATTERY WAY

WHEREAS, Montgomery County, Tennessee, is vitally interested in the economic welfare of its citizens and wishes to provide the necessary leadership to enhance this area’s capabilities for growth and development; and

WHEREAS, the provision of jobs to area citizens by local industry is both necessary and vital to the economic well-being of Montgomery County; and

WHEREAS, the Industrial Highway Act of 1959 authorizes the Tennessee Department of Transportation to contract with cities and counties for the construction of “Industrial Highways” to provide access to industrial areas and to facilitate the development and expansion of industry within the State of Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, LG Chem plans to construct a manufacturing facility in Montgomery County, Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, the construction of an industrial road will serve said proposed plant and other supporting industries and is necessary and vital to the successful completion of this project and the future economic well-being of this area; and

WHEREAS, the road will connect Industrial Boulevard and Charles Bell Road and will be dedicated to Montgomery County, Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, the Industrial Development Board will be required to pay for the civil and environmental engineering and inspections of the road while under construction; and

WHEREAS, Montgomery County will be responsible for all maintenance of the proposed industrial access roadway upon completion of this project.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by Montgomery County, that a contract be entered into with the Tennessee Department of Transportation for assistance in construction and completion of the herein proposed industrial access highway under the provisions of the Industrial Highway Act of 1959.

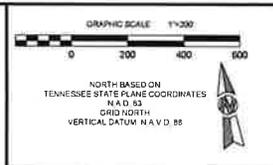
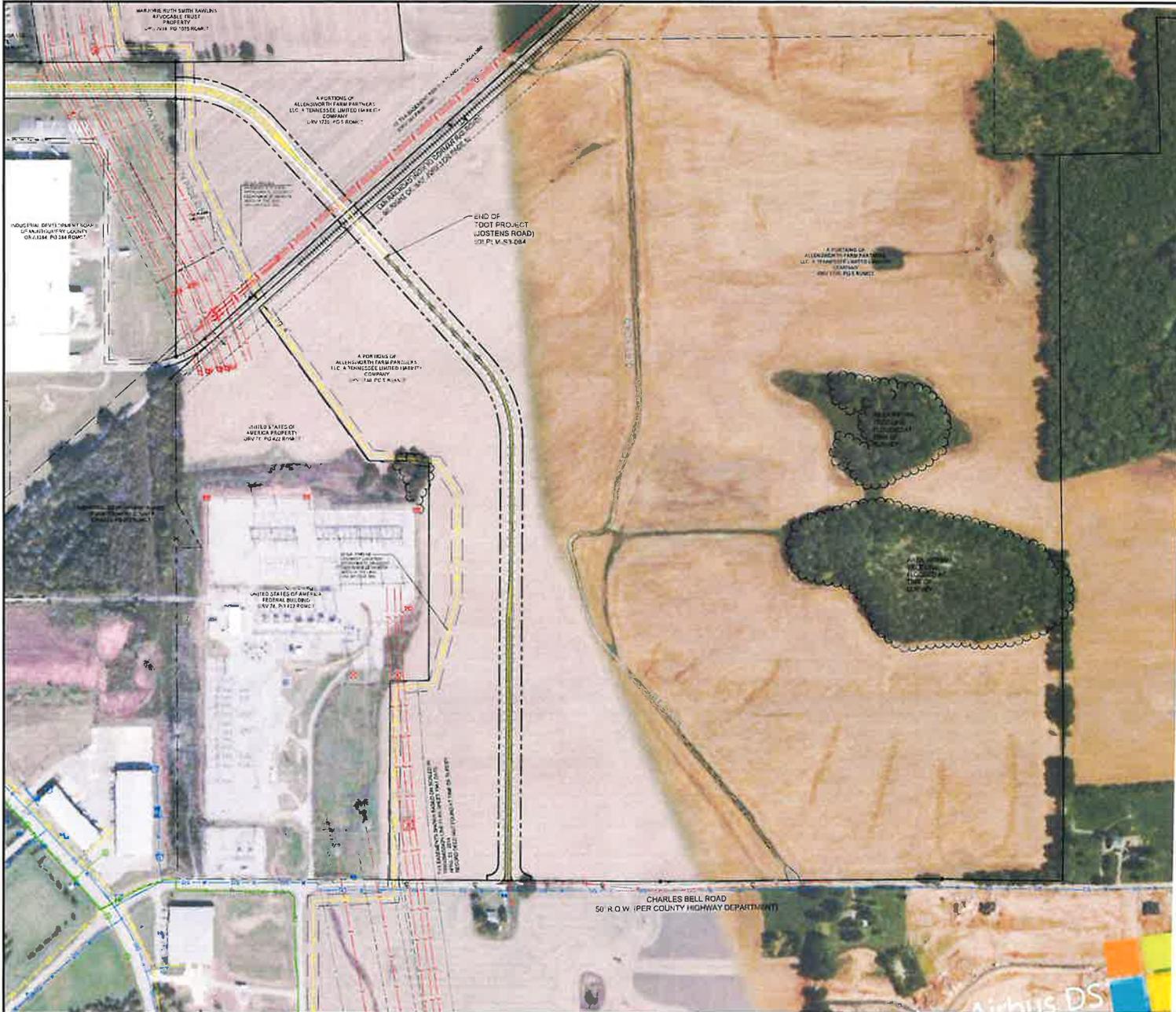

RESOLUTION AMENDING RESOLUTION 22-11-7 TO ADD AN ADDITIONAL SEVENTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$75,000) TO THE THREE HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$350,000) PREVIOUSLY APPROVED TO THE BUDGET OF THE MONTGOMERY COUNTY HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT FOR ENGINEERING FUNDS NEEDED FOR EXCELL/ HWY 12 SERVICE

WHEREAS, the intersection of Highway 12, Excell Road, Hickory Point Road, and East Old Ashland City Road has become a major safety concern due to increased traffic amounts along these roads combined with poor intersection configuration and needs to be re-designed; and

WHEREAS, the Montgomery County Highway Department wishes to have this professional service completed as soon as possible; and

WHEREAS, an additional \$75,000 is needed, along with the original \$350,000 that was previously approved, to fund this service which includes complete design and Right of Way acquisition; and

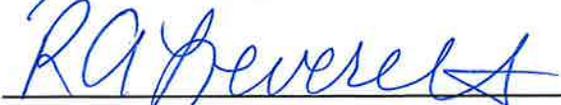
WHEREAS, the additional funds would provide an alternate option for consideration to accommodate a potential development at the intersection; and
