Does your treated salt item refer to salt treated with YPS (an anticaking agent) or are you looking for an enhanced corrosion inhibitor type product?
 - Coarse salt is our go-to road salt and works well for our needs. Sometimes it's treated with YPS. Please remove treated salt from the bid table.
- 2. Similarly, is your coarse salt item standard road salt (often treated with YPS) or is it referring to a more specific premium coarse salt?
